The Assistant Director of Music and Organist assists the Director of Music with all aspects of the music programs of Christ Church.

Specific accountabilities include:

GENERAL

- Maintain regular office hours; Tue-Fri, with Wed-Thu evening rehearsals and as needed on weekends
- Attend Rector's staff meetings weekly in order to have an overview of all parish functions and programs communicating as necessary those affected by decisions or planned activities.
- Attend monthly Liturgical Commission meetings.
- Collaborate with Director of Music in planning all music for worship including service music, hymns, choral anthems and organ repertoire for the church year.
- Assist Music Program Administrator in the management of the music library, procurement of new music, distribution of music and maintenance of library.
- Assist Music Program Administrator with proofreading and production of bulletins and concert programs.
- Assist with articles for the Disciple and News and Notices regarding the music program in cooperation with the Director of Music.

ORGANIST


- Play standard organ repertoire for all regularly scheduled services, feast days and other special services of the church in collaboration with the Director of Music.
- Accompany at the organ or the piano The Christ Church Choir, The CC Schola Cantorum and the Children's choirs in services, concerts and on tours.
- In collaboration with the Director of Music, play for funerals at no additional fee.
- In collaboration with the Director of Music, consult with families in planning music and play for weddings with an additional fee.
- Arrange for substitute organists, from an approved list, as necessary.
- Assist in recruiting other instrumentalists when needed and rehearse with them when appropriate.
- Prepare and play occasional concerts.

CHOIR DIRECTOR

- Participate as directed by the Director of Music in weekly choir rehearsals to prepare for services and to educate choir members in Anglican Episcopal liturgy.
- Participate in annual choir retreats, choir camps and choir tours as determined by the Director of Music.
- Assist in recruitment of new volunteer and professional choir members
- Tutor small groups and individuals in music theory, sight-singing and RSCM Assessments.
- In the absence of the Director of Music, supervise section leaders and volunteers in the music program
- In the absence of the Director of Music be prepared to lead and accompany all rehearsals and services.
